## **Project Objectives**

The objective of An Coimisiún was to develop an ambitious National Election and Democracy Study (NEDS) for Ireland, with high quality polling to inform across other research strands, but also to provide the academic community, stakeholders, the public, the media and the political system with high quality information.

To begin this process, An Coimisiún conducted **pilot research surveys** in the runup to the two referendums, the first dealing with the constitutional definition of the **family**; while the second dealt with the issue of **care**, which took place on the 8th March 2024. The requirement was for RED C to conduct the completion of **two standalone surveys** conducted in the weeks before the referendum. The parameters of the surveys were as follows:

- 1. Each survey was designed to be **representative of all adults** in Ireland who are eligible to vote.
- 2. One survey was conducted by **telephone**, while the second was conducted **online**.
- 3. Each survey was conducted **1-2 weeks prior** to the referendum date

The survey covered a range of topics as shown below:

- 1. Public opinion regarding the referendums and the issues which they aim to address;
- 2. Satisfaction with and perceptions of Ireland's democracy and political system;
- 3. Awareness of An Coimisiún Toghcháin and its work;
- 4. Attitudes, beliefs and knowledge on a range of issues drawing on best practice in election studies to facilitate comparative research.

## Methodology

- RED C carried out:
  - 1,041 interviews online between 26<sup>th</sup> February and 7<sup>th</sup> March 2024
  - 1,001 interviews on the telephone between 19<sup>th</sup> February and 7<sup>th</sup> March 2024
- A mixed methods approach was used, with half the sample coming from our bespoke online panel RED C Live and the other half contacted by phone through our call centre
- Interviews were conducted across the country and the results weighted to the profile of all adults in line with the latest CSO projections
- Panellists were chosen at random to complete the poll, with quotas set and weights allocated on age, gender, class, region, education level & working status to ensure a nationally representative sample.
- A further past vote quota and weight is included that looks at how people on our panel voted at the last election (gathered at the time) and controls on this. Vote intention data is also weighted to take account of claimed likely turnout on the day of an election.
- A small ad hoc omnibus than ran following the referendum was used to capture time of decision making and reasons for non-turnout. This ran between 14th – 21st March on a nationally representative sample of n-1,000 Irish adults.


## Voter Turnout

### Likelihood to vote x vote intention








## **Those certain to vote x Demographics**










## **Understanding of the Issues over time**









## **Understanding of issues – all those saying 8-10**












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
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## **Profile of Voters in Care/Family Referendum**










#### **Church Attendance**

Q3. To what extent are you decided on whether you will vote yes to support or no to oppose the proposed changes to the constitution in each case?



## **Political leanings in Ireland**




## Profile of voters x by political leaning







## Shift in Opinion x Political Leaning



## **Reason for Voting – Those Definitely/Leaning No**

#### Definitely/Leaning No

#### Lack of Trust for the Government

A number of people that voted no for the Family Referendum chose to do so as they distrust the government and will vote no as a form of protest / boycott to any proposed change that doesn't inherently affect them.

There is also a sense that having **voted yes** would **give rise to more immigration into Ireland**.

#### Weak Wording

The proposed wording gave rise to concern and especially around the term "durable relationship". This term was left open to interpretation, and some noted that it was more problematic than the word "family" as it could raise significant issues down the line, particularly in the courts.

#### Hold Traditional Views

More traditionalistic views feel that the sanctity of marriage is being attacked and should be kept between a man and a woman and that anyone considered a single parents is assumed to already be recognised as a family. They feel that the Constitution should stick with the status quo.

#### Not Enough Information in General and on Future Outcomes

Due to a lack of clarity on the matter at hand, concern was raised over the potential of possible ramifications resulting from a yes vote. Many felt that this would **result in a number of cases going to the courts,** when clearly defined implications are much more preferable.

I don't have enough clarity, I have listened to the pros and cons on both radio and television, and the yes vote isn't convincing me, the no voters are raising questions, and if I haven't made a decision by 8th March, I will vote No. But I'm open to persuasion.



## **Reasons for being Undecided**

#### **Further Information Needed**

The main factor that was holding people back on deciding how to vote was the overall **lack of information** available detailing what the proposed changes would entail and any results that may have followed.

#### Lack of Clarity

The proposed change in wording lead to confusion for many as to how they should vote, with the term **"durable relationship"** being the **roadblock** for many – an ambiguous term left open to interpretation.



#### **Conversations with Others**

Some people relied on conversations with friends / family before deciding on how they voted. There was also desire to watch debates to hear what professionals were saying on the matter.

Lack of clarity / information on the Family Referendum has led to people becoming disengaged and lacking confidence on how to vote. These voters likely shifted to NO.

#### Family Dynamics have Changed

The current climate of Ireland has changed tremendously in recent years in relation to civil rights, allowing the **dynamics of families to shift and evolve overtime**. The change to the Constitution would help underpin these Families as concrete and be recognised by the government.



#### Re-word to Reflect a Modern Ireland

Among those who voted yes, many felt that the **current language** used in the Constitution is **out-dated** and does not accurately reflect a modern-day Ireland and would like to see **greater equality and progressiveness in Ireland**.



#### Aligning with Personal Views / Right Thing to do

Many feel that the decision to vote yes was due to the **alignment of their own personal views, what they have heard from friends/ family/ online/ political parties** and can even go as far as wanting to vote the opposite of those backing the no vote.

There were a number of people that stated that they aren't exactly sure of the proposed changes, but felt like **voting yes was the right thing to do**.





#### Definitely/Leaning No

## Frustration with the Government

General distrust in the government on a total level seeps through as a reason people voted no in the Care Referendum

Others who aren't as sceptical felt that the government would be in a position to leave the **onus of care on the families, absconding them from any responsibility.** 

#### Insubstantial Wording

The proposed change to the wording of the Care Referendum was viewed as weak and lacked clarity, especially on the word "strive" – the people of Ireland wanted a stronger more defined commitment from the government to ensure that they will still support the provision of care.

#### Legal Ramifications

Overall lack of information and clarity on the matter left people unsure of any potential legal ramifications that may have resulted from a yes vote. There was worry what this would mean for current carers in Ireland and if they would be supported or not. I'm being influenced by those who have concerns that the State will wash their hands of care and it make it solely the responsibility of the family.







The people of Ireland also wanted to see recognition for carers and the work they do providing for others.



#### Wording to Reflect Current-Day Ireland

The majority of people in Ireland who voted YES for the change proposed in the Care Referendum as they felt that the **current language in the Constitution is outdated** and does not reflect the climate of carers today.

#### Similar Roles in the Home

Care within the home has changed significantly in recent years, whereby the responsibility of caregiving can be appointed to anyone in the household and not just a woman and the people of Ireland want the Constitution to reflect this as such.

#### Right Thing to do for Carers

The updated wording to the Constitution would give **recognition to those that currently provide care for others**. Even though some may not fully understand the changes, they **felt it was the right thing to do**. I am still struggling the understand what the outcome would be but because they want to change it, I have to believe it's for a good reason.



















## Satisfaction with Democracy in Ireland x Vote Intention

















## Political knowledge - % correct X Care Referendum vote intention C




Political knowledge - % correct X Care Referendum vote intention (Online only)











## **Happiness Index (Feelings of Happiness Yesterday)**













Q8: Before today, how familiar were you of the organisation an Coimisiún Toghcháin – the electoral commission?












